## **Glossary of Key Terms**

Children's Wellbeing and Schools Bill: Legislation introducing reforms to strengthen multi-agency safeguarding, mandate FGDM, and improve data sharing.

**Contextual Safeguarding:** An approach to understanding and responding to risks children face outside the home, such as in peer groups or online.

**Evidence-Based Interventions (EBIs):** Support programmes or practices proven effective through research and evaluation.

**Families First Partnership (FFP):** A government programme aimed at transforming family support systems to provide earlier, integrated help and protection for children and families.

**Family Group Decision Making (FGDM):** A voluntary process where a family network creates a plan to address concerns about a child's welfare, supported by professionals. Often delivered through Family Group Conferences (FGCs).

**Family Help:** A whole family, early intervention support system for families with multiple or complex needs, including targeted early help and child in need services.

**Family Help Lead Practitioner (FHLP):** A professional (social worker or other qualified practitioner) who coordinates support for a family, maintains relationships, and leads direct work throughout their engagement with Family Help.

**Front Door Arrangements:** The initial point of contact for families seeking help, where referrals are triaged to appropriate services.

**Lead Child Protection Practitioner (LCPP):** An experienced social worker embedded in MACPTs who leads statutory child protection decisions and supports practitioners.

Multi-agency Child Protection Team (MACPT): A team of experts from social care, police, health, education, and other agencies responsible for child protection decisions and actions under Section 47 of the Children Act 1989.

**National Framework (Children's Social Care):** A framework setting out principles, outcomes, and enablers for good practice in children's social care.

**Plymouth Safeguarding Children Partnership (PSCP):** local partnership of Designated Safeguarding Partners (Health, Social Care and Police) and other key

statutory and VCS partners with responsibilities for safeguarding children including Education.

**Section 17 (Children Act 1989):** Legal duty for local authorities to provide services to children in need to safeguard and promote their welfare.

**Section 47 (Children Act 1989):** Legal duty for local authorities to investigate if a child is suffering or likely to suffer significant harm.

**Team Around the Family (TAF):** A group of professionals coordinated by the FHLP to provide tailored support to a family.
